CCP offers a PhD program in Counseling Psychology that is accredited by the American Psychological Association (APA). Successful candidates will be expected to coordinate CPY 783: *Field Placement* for students enrolled in the PhD program. Essential duties include: conducting site visits for the currently approved field placement sites; holding weekly individual and small-group student case conferences; availability for on-call for emergency consultation with students related to clinical cases; managing site agreements and student training agreements; recruiting new field placement sites and coordinate with CCP Clinical Committee for review and approval; working with Faculty Head and Director of Training on any issues related to student progress; preparing reports and proposals as needed; and providing service to the program, college, university, profession, and community as appropriate.

The position reports to the Faculty Head of CCP, who will determine the work load. Successful candidates will also be expected to participate in service to the institution and profession as appropriate. This is a half-time, benefits-eligible, non-tenure eligible position renewable on an academic year basis contingent upon satisfactory performance, availability of resources, and the needs of the university.
